EDUCATION AND TRAINING FOR REFUGEES AND ASYLUM SEEKERS

On 1 January 2017 some positive changes were made to eligibility requirements for NSW government-funded training to give refugees and asylum seekers access to training at no cost to them. This includes skill sets and qualifications up to a Certificate IV level in the areas of aged care, child care, fabrication, welding and engineering, beauty, children's services, business and hospitality. Also offered are English courses and Foundation Skills like reading, writing,

listening, speaking and learning skills taught in a way to help them with the study or work area of interest.

The economic outlook for NSW is bright with the state currently experiencing the strongest jobs growth in the nation, particularly in these service-oriented industries.

As Australia's largest provider of vocational education and training, and the established public provider, TAFE NSW has a longstanding history

of programs for the disadvantaged in areas of the community not traditionally served by the private sector.
